# FFA President: Angel Fulmer

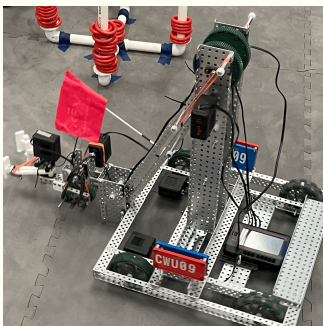

Mathias Hamilton said that the most difficult part of robotics is the coding. "You constantly have to rearrange and fix the code," he said. The main game that the students are presented with is "Ring Stack," the students must design a robot that can carry plastic rings and set them on high and low goals within a 12 by 12 playing field. They are also challenged with additional elements, the previous one being that the manipulator had to be 3d printed. Amazing job to the robotics team and remember it's never too late to join!

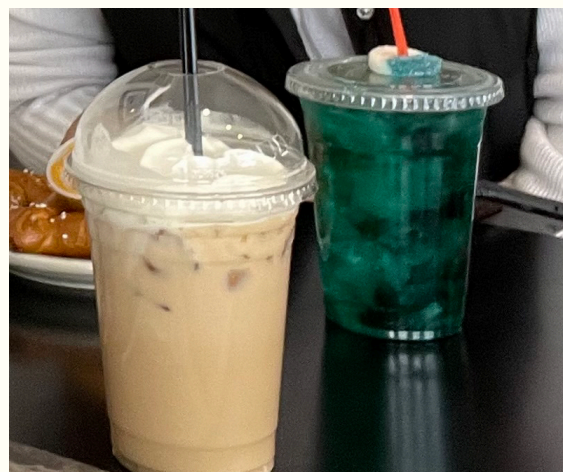

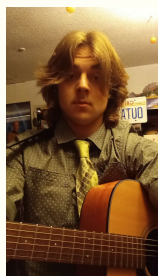
